I always gave myself certain goals during my sporting career and it's important to have some more now. It is a great project that we are setting up with the IDEC GROUP. - Tony Parker: born in Bruges in 1982. After starting his basketball career in Europe, Tony Parker was taken on by the San Antonio Spurs in 2001. Just two years later, the Spurs and their French captain won the NBA championship title. They won their second title in 2005. In the same year, Tony finished third in the European championship with the French team. In 2007, the French player earned the title of Most Valuable Player in the finals and became three times NBA champion. In 2011, the French team made it to second place in the European championships before becoming champions in 2013. "TP" won his fourth NBA title with the Spurs in 2014. After becoming president of the ASVEL Basketball team in 2014, he won the French LNB championship in 2016 and became president and major shareholder in the Lyon ASVEL women's team. The Lyon women took the French championship title in 2019.
